NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION

The property at 533 Tennessee St. was listed as a non-contributing property within the Pinkney I Historic District on 7/15/2004. Upon further research, submitted to the KS-SHPO in summer 2023, the building's addition appears to be older and does not negatively impact the integrity. When originally nominated, the alteration was considered non-historic. Several other contributing buildings have similar alterations: 516 Ohio, 511 Tennessee, 505 Tennessee, and 512 Ohio. The Kansas State Historic Preservation Office requests that the property be indicated and changed to a contributing property in the district nomination for the National Register of Historic Places.

NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION

The garage at 501 Ohio Street was listed as a noncontributing property within the Pinkney I Historic District on 7/15/2004. Upon further research, submitted to the KS-SHPO in spring 2025, SHPO re-evaluated the building. The Sanborn Fire Insurance Maps show that the building originally had stucco siding. Also, additional historic photos show the primary construction materials as clay blocks. Our office determined that the garage is historic, retains integrity, and falls within the period of significance.

The Kansas State Historic Preservation Office requests that the property be indicated and changed to a contributing property in the district nomination for the National Register of Historic Places.



NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION

The Pinckney I Historic District was listed in the National Register on July 15, 2004. The name was based on the street on which the district was located, "Pinckney." The namesake, Charles Cotesworth Pinckney, was a Revolutionary War General and a supporter of slavery and the Fugitive Slave Act. The City of Lawrence was founded by the abolitionist-supported Massachusetts Emigrant Aid Society. The neighborhood association identified a want to change the name by the neighbors. William Pinkney (without the "c") was an American statesman and diplomat from Maryland. He delivered an anti-slavery speech that was turned into a widely circulated pamphlet. The neighborhood association would like to change the name of this nomination to the "Pinkney I Historic District" and remove the "c" from the spelling. See letter from Shane Heiman, President of the Pinkney Neighborhood Association.

The Kansas State Historic Preservation Office requests the primary name be changed to "Pinkney" and "Pinckney" be referenced in the "other/alternative names" to aid researchers.

DOCUMENTATION

Supporting letter and information from the neighborhood association.

Greetings:

As you may have been aware, the neighborhood in Northeast Lawrence previously known as Pinckney Neighborhood undertook a process over the past year to reconsider its name after fully realizing the namesake, Charles Cotesworth Pinckney, was not only a general in the Revolutionary War under the direction of George Washington, but also a staunch supporter of slavery and the Fugitive Slave Act. Honoring such a person appeared in conflict with the founding of Lawrence by the abolitionist-supported Massachusetts Emigrant Aid Society. Research conducted by residents in the neighborhood has confirmed that a person admired by the founders of Lawrence was William Pinkney (without the "c") who lived from 1764 to 1822 and was an American statesman and diplomat from Maryland. He delivered an important anti-slavery speech in 1789 that was turned into a pamphlet widely circulated by abolitionists. When the city was surveyed and platted in 1854, the original name for what is now 6th Street was Pinkney Street.

Residents of our neighborhood, working through the neighborhood association, surveyed neighborhood residents about the desire to rename the neighborhood in order to disassociate it from Charles Cotesworth Pinckney and the pro-slavery movement. After identifying strong support for changing the name of the neighborhood, the committee of residents undertook a careful and deliberate process to gather possible new names for the neighborhood, research and narrow the list of possible names, and hold a final vote for the new neighborhood name. The final vote resulted in establishing the new name as the Pinkney Neighborhood, honoring William Pinkney. Attached for your information is a resolution of the Pinkney Neighborhood Association formally changing the name of the neighborhood and the neighborhood association.


